***No construction impact over Thanksgiving holiday on Gateway Project***

GREENVILLE, S.C. – Holiday travel is nerve wracking already, so the 85-385 Gateway Project is doing its best to alleviate the stress.

No traffic impacts are expected along the project site from around 1 p.m. Wednesday, November 23, until Monday morning. Construction will be ongoing, but there will be no lane closures or shifts during the holiday season.

The 85-385 Gateway Project is a major overhaul of the I-85 and I-385 interchange. There will also be improvements to Roper Mountain Road, Woodruff Road, Garlington Road, Miller Road and Chrome Drive. It also encompasses construction of 10 new bridge structures, which includes two flyovers, rehabilitation of two existing bridge structures, and modifications to the substructure of one existing bridge, all of which will facilitate this new interchange system.

The work being performed on these roads and bridges will help alleviate traffic congestion throughout this entire corridor. Construction began in February of 2016 and will continue until 2020.

The 85-385 Gateway Interchange Improvement Project will provide an economic boost to the Upstate, improve safety for the traveling public, and increase the capacity of this Interchange to function more efficiently for many years to come.
